REPORTS OF STANDING COMMITTEES AND DIVISIONS

Knoblach from the Committee on Ways and Means to which was referred:

H. F. No. 470, A bill for an act relating to public safety; creating the crime of tampering with a public safety motor vehicle; establishing criminal penalties; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 609.

Reported the same back with the following amendments:

Page 1, line 11, delete "knowing that" and insert "because"

Page 1, line 12, delete "felony" and insert "crime"

Page 1, line 17, delete everything after "sentenced" and insert a colon

Page 1, delete line 18 and insert:

"(1) to a gross misdemeanor if the violation reduces the value of the property by not more than \$500; or

(2) to imprisonment for not more than two years or to payment of a fine of not more than \$5,000, or both, if the violation:

(i) reduces the value of the property by more than \$500 but not more than \$1,000 as measured by the cost of repair and replacement; or

(ii) creates a reasonably foreseeable risk of bodily harm but does not otherwise damage the vehicle."
