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The following House Files were introduced:

Anderson, P.; Backer and Erickson introduced:

H. F. No. 2400, A bill for an act relating to natural resources; establishing program for riparian-buffer compensation; appropriating money; amending Minnesota Statutes 2016, section 13.7931, by adding a subdivision; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 103F.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources Policy and Finance.

Jessup; Neu; Fenton; Barr, R., and Nornes introduced:

H. F. No. 2401, A bill for an act relating to higher education; establishing a grant program for students with intellectual and developmental disabilities; appropriating money; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 136A.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Higher Education and Career Readiness Policy and Finance.

Franke and Cornish introduced:

H. F. No. 2402, A bill for an act relating to public safety; including attempt to enter a school to school trespass crime; increasing the penalty for trespassing on school property; amending Minnesota Statutes 2016, section 609.605, subdivision 4.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Public Safety and Security Policy and Finance.

H. F. No. 2403, A bill for an act relating to legacy funding; creating the motion-picture investment incentive program; appropriating money; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 116J.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Legacy Funding Finance.

H. F. No. 2404, A bill for an act relating to capital investment; appropriating money for expanding the Runestone Community Center in Alexandria; authorizing the sale and issuance of state bonds.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Job Growth and Energy Affordability Policy and Finance.

Petersburg, Cornish and Gunther introduced:

H. F. No. 2405, A bill for an act relating to arts and cultural heritage; appropriating money to complete Waseca County Veterans Memorial.

H. F. No. 2407, A bill for an act relating to capital investment; appropriating money for a regional residential crisis stabilization services clinic in Chaska; authorizing the sale and issuance of state bonds.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Health and Human Services Finance.

H. F. No. 2408, A bill for an act relating to economic development; appropriating money for the youth-at-work grant program.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Education Finance.

H. F. No. 2410, A bill for an act relating to arts and cultural heritage; appropriating money for Minnesota Historical Society.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Legacy Funding Finance.

Lueck introduced:

H. F. No. 2411, A bill for an act relating to natural resources; appropriating money for Minnesota Aquatic Invasive Species Research Center.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources Policy and Finance.

Drazkowski introduced:

H. F. No. 2412, A bill for an act relating to taxation; property; repealing the authority to establish service districts; repealing Minnesota Statutes 2016, sections 428A.01; 428A.02; 428A.03; 428A.04; 428A.05; 428A.06; 428A.07; 428A.08; 428A.09; 428A.10; 428A.101.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Taxes.

Lohmer introduced:

H. F. No. 2413, A bill for an act relating to family law; modifying parenting presumptions; amending Minnesota Statutes 2016, sections 518.17, subdivision 1; 518.175, subdivision 1.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Civil Law and Data Practices Policy.

Howe introduced:

H. F. No. 2414, A bill for an act relating to the military; establishing a service member and veteran service center pilot grant program; authorizing use of Support Our Troops account funds; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 197.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on State Government Finance.

Bliss introduced:

H. F. No. 2415, A bill for an act relating to arts and culture; appropriating money for Veterans' Voices radio programming.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Legacy Funding Finance.

Scott introduced:

H. F. No. 2416, A bill for an act relating to open government; transferring certain responsibilities under chapter 13 from the commissioner of administration to the Office of Administrative Hearings.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Civil Law and Data Practices Policy.

Hamilton introduced:

H. F. No. 2417, A bill for an act relating to environment; appropriating money for county feedlot program.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources Policy and Finance.

Anderson, S., introduced:

H. F. No. 2418, A bill for an act relating to residential mortgage originators, residential mortgage servicers, and mortgage loan originators; allowing expungement of certain violations; instituting application process times; amending Minnesota Statutes 2016, sections 58.06, by adding a subdivision; 58.11, by adding a subdivision; 58.12, by adding a subdivision; 58A.04, by adding a subdivision; 58A.12.
