The following House Files were introduced:

Lee and Dehn, R., introduced:

H. F. No. 4478, A bill for an act relating to environment; requiring analysis of cumulative pollution when issuing permits in certain areas; amending Minnesota Statutes 2016, section 116.07, subdivision 4a.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources Policy and Finance.

Zerwas and Murphy, E., introduced:

H. F. No. 4479, A bill for an act relating to health occupations; requiring health care providers to obtain a direct secure messaging address; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapters 62J; 214.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Health and Human Services Reform.

Bernardy and Kunesh-Podein introduced:

H. F. No. 4480, A bill for an act relating to capital investment; appropriating money for demolition and replacement of the Rice Creek railroad bridge in New Brighton; authorizing the sale and issuance of state bonds.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Transportation Finance.

Hoppe introduced:

H. F. No. 4481, A bill for an act relating to insurance; auto; changing requirements relating to the assignment of benefits and arbitration; amending Minnesota Statutes 2016, sections 65B.525, by adding a subdivision; 65B.54, subdivision 1.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Commerce and Regulatory Reform.

Koznick introduced:

H. F. No. 4482, A bill for an act relating to taxation; sales and use; providing an exemption for certain aggregate materials delivered by railroads; amending Minnesota Statutes 2017 Supplement, section 297A.61, subdivision 3.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Taxes.

Kiel introduced:

H. F. No. 4483, A bill for an act relating to arts and cultural heritage; appropriating money for a new heritage center in Fosston.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Legacy Funding Finance.

Sandstede, O'Driscoll and Nelson introduced:

H. F. No. 4484, A bill for an act relating to local government; modifying hospital board terms of office; amending Minnesota Statutes 2016, section 447.32, subdivision 1.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Government Operations and Elections Policy.

Franke, Fenton and Jurgens introduced:

H. F. No. 4485, A bill for an act relating to health; appropriating money to the Department of Health for upgrades to the Public Health Lab that will facilitate remedial investigations and response actions to address discharges of perfluorochemicals by 3M Company.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Health and Human Services Finance.

Franson and Hamilton introduced:

H. F. No. 4486, A bill for an act relating to public safety; providing that the sale or possession of cannabidiol is not a crime; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 152.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Public Safety and Security Policy and Finance.
