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Technical summaries of bills sent to the governor

Editor’s Note: *The Summary section of New Laws 2002 includes information about all 185 bills and two resolutions the Legislature (House and Senate) approved during the 2002 regular session.*

Of the bills the Legislature approved, Gov. Jesse Ventura vetoed eight in full and line-item vetoed portions of one. Six vetoes were successfully overridden by both houses.

Most of the bills in this section are categorized numerically by chapter number under the House committee of origin (the committee to which the speaker of the House first referred them). Each entry includes: a brief title; House file, Senate file, and chapter numbers; chief authors; the official technical title as it appeared on the version of the bill the governor considered; the enactment date; and the effective date(s).

The following term definitions will be helpful in reading this section:

- **Enactment date** — The date the governor signed the bill into law.
- † — The bill was filed or became law without the governor’s signature.
- **Vetoed** — The governor did not approve the bill.
- **Line-item veto** — The governor signed the appropriations bill but vetoed individual item(s) to which he objected.
- ♦ — The governor’s veto was overridden by the Legislature. An override requires a two-thirds vote in each house (90 votes in the House and 45 votes in the Senate).
- * — An asterisk marks the version of the bill the House and Senate approved and passed on to the governor.
- **Effective date** — Each act takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day it becomes effective, unless the act specifies a different time.
- **Aug. 1, 2002** — Each act the governor signs into law, except for those that make appropriations, takes effect on Aug. 1 following its final enactment, unless the act specifies a different date.
- **July 1, 2002** — An appropriations act, or an act having appropriations items, takes effect at the beginning of the first day of July following its final enactment, unless the act specifies a different date.
- **Upon local approval** — A special law requiring approval from the local government unit it affects becomes effective the day after the local governing body files a certificate with the secretary of state, unless the act specifies a later date.
- **Various dates** — Different articles or sections of the act have different effective dates which are cited at the end of each article.
- **With exceptions** — An act is effective, for the most part, on one particular date, but there are some minor exceptions.
- **With qualifications** — The act adds conditions to the effective date.
- **Retroactive** — The act or parts of the act go into effect as of a specified date in the past.

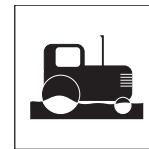

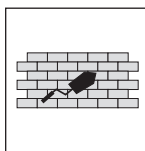

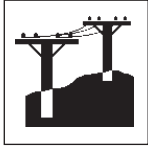

2002 Special Session

Editor's Note: *The Legislature met for nearly five hours on Sept. 19 to enact a flood relief plan to aid northwestern Minnesota and other areas affected by flooding during the late spring. In all, 14 House and nine Senate bills were introduced. Gov. Jesse Ventura signed three into law and vetoed none. Summaries of all three are below.*

★ GREATER MINNESOTA

Flood relief package

Residents of 19 Minnesota counties that suffered flood-related damage during the late spring/early summer of 2002 received some assistance in a new law passed by the Legislature.

In a Sept. 19 special session, both the House and Senate passed a bill that provides \$31.78 million in relief. Gov. Jesse Ventura signed the new law Sept. 20.

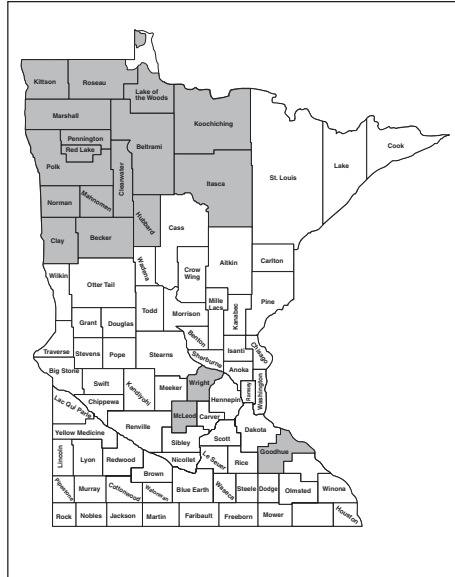
The aftermath of the storm was greatest in Roseau where damage was estimated at \$100 million at the time of the special session, with more expected from things, such as cracked home foundations, when winter sets in. Eighty percent of homes and 100 businesses in Roseau were damaged or destroyed by flood waters.

More than \$29 million of the funding comes from new appropriations in the law and \$2.35 million is from a reallocation of current funds.

About \$8.3 million is included in the law to match federal emergency funds. This amount covers both the state and local match required. Under the program the federal government contributes 75 percent aid, and state and local governments contribute the remainder. Usually the community is on the hook for a 10 percent contribution. (Sec. 2)

Of the \$4 million allocated for housing assistance, \$3 million is directed to the economic development and housing challenge program to fund a variety of activities, including housing repair, acquisition, new construction, and refinancing. The remaining \$1 million is for publicly owned, permanent rental housing. (Sec. 3)

The law appropriates \$2 million to be used to assist communities with repairs to public infrastructure, including storm sewers, water and wastewater systems, and utility service. (Sec. 4)



A flood relief law, passed during the 2002 Special Session, provides aid to these 19 counties across Minnesota.

For agricultural assistance, the law contains \$3 million to make disaster payments to farmers. Up to \$50,000 of this amount can be used by the Department of Agriculture to administer the program. (Sec. 5)

In an effort to reduce the impact on Roseau schools due to families who move out of the community during the 2002-03 school year, up to \$40,000 will be appropriated to account for the difference in pupil unit aid. Rep. Maxine Penas (R-Badger), the House sponsor of the new law, said no families had yet moved away but could once winter sets in and they may not have adequate housing. The pupil aid amount decreases to \$30,000, \$20,000, and \$10,000 in the next three school years. (Sec. 6)

More than \$17.1 million is allocated for transportation needs, including \$10.1 million from the cancellation of general fund money appropriated in 2000 for road construction. Another \$5 million is allocated to aid local governments in road and bridge repair and replacement. The state transportation commissioner will determine project priorities. The remaining \$2 million is for reconstruction and repair of state highways and bridges. (Sec. 7)

The new law amends the 2002 capital investment law (HF3618*/SFnone/CH393) so that flood mitigation needs in the counties are included among the list of projects eligible for funding, up to \$2 million. Grants are exempt from a \$150,000 limit set in state statute. (Secs. 12, 22)

The Minnesota Investment Fund received \$3 million for grants to local governments to make grants or loans directly to businesses affected by the flood. As part of the funding, recipients must set goals for jobs retained and wages paid within the flood area. Another \$1 million is included in the new law to help clean up buildings, including businesses, where at least a portion of the cost is attributable to petroleum contamination or to buy property substantially damaged by a petroleum tank release. (Sec. 4)

In addition, several property tax-related provisions are included in the law.

The law requires the county auditor to adjust the original net tax capacity of a tax increment financing (TIF) district upon request of the municipality that approved the district. Net capacity is the amount used as a base value for the TIF district. This is effective beginning with taxes payable the first year following the declaration. (Sec. 16)

For businesses, up to \$50,000 in improvements to commercial and industrial property will qualify for a valuation exclusion for assessment purposes. Among the conditions that must be met are that the building must be in a city or town with a population of less than 10,000, the total estimated market value of the land and buildings must be \$150,000 or less for assessment year 2002, and the improvements must be made prior to Jan. 1, 2004. (Sec. 14)

Business owners in a county declared a disaster area who were to have paid the second half of their 2002 property taxes by Oct. 15 now have until May 15, 2003, to do so without penalty, provided the first half of the taxes was paid by May 16, 2002, and they will not be able to pay the second half because of the flooding. (Sec. 19)

An aid program for cities sustaining significant tax base losses is established in the law. County assessors are required to compute a hypothetical taxable net tax capacity for each city and county based on 2003 market values and class rates in effect for 2002. Then the amount by which the 2002 value exceeds the hypothetical number is considered the city's "flood net tax capacity loss." If that loss is 5 percent or greater, the city will be entitled to flood loss aid equal to its loss multiplied by the city's average local tax rate for taxes payable in 2003. The aid is available for only one year. (Sec. 15)

If the commissioner of public safety determines that a local government has suffered financial hardship due to the flood, early payments of property tax aid will be made by the Revenue Department. The new law also allows

all local governments to request early aid payments to address cash flow needs. Previous law only permitted cities to utilize this option. (Sec. 17)

County boards may grant a property tax abatement of 50 percent of 2002 property taxes for eligible properties in the flood area. The property owner is not required to apply for the abatement. All abatements must be granted by Oct. 31, 2002. (Sec. 18)

The new law is effective Sept. 21, 2002. It includes benefits for the following counties: Becker, Beltrami, Clay, Clearwater, Goodhue, Hubbard, Itasca, Kittson, Koochiching, Lake of the Woods, Mahnommen, Marshall, McLeod, Norman, Pennington, Polk, Red Lake, Roseau, and Wright.

Sen. LeRoy Stumpf (DFL-Thief River Falls) sponsored the law in the Senate.

Calculating alternative minimum taxes

A new law will allow the state's alternative minimum taxpayers to deduct charitable contributions.

The alternative minimum tax was originally created to address concerns that some of the nation's wealthiest individuals, using legal deductions and other income exclusions, were paying little or no income tax.

What the alternative minimum tax tries to ensure is that individuals who capitalize on certain tax deductions, which theoretically may erase all income tax burden, still pay some tax. That alternative minimum tax is then calculated using a structure with a broader tax base and lower rates.

Charitable contributions qualify as one type of deduction taxpayers may make from their income tax obligations. And a 2002 Minnesota Supreme Court ruling, which removed

the tax deductibility of charitable contributions made by Minnesotans who are required to pay the state's alternative minimum tax, raised concerns that contributions made to nonprofit organizations could be significantly reduced if taxpayers are no longer allowed to deduct them.

Rep. Ron Abrams (R-Minnetonka), the House sponsor, said that those paying alternative minimum taxes in the state contribute more than \$350 million to charities.

The new law defines the threshold of deduction for charitable contributions on taxes paid after Dec. 31, 2001. It allows affected taxpayers to deduct contributions of more than 1.3 percent of their federal adjusted gross income.

Abrams said the new law is a temporary solution that addresses concerns raised by the court decision, adding that the issue would likely be addressed further during the 2003 regular session.

A federal minimum tax was established in 1969 and the state adopted a similar tax in 1977.

In Minnesota, taxpayers first calculate their regular tax liability and then determine whether they owe the alternative minimum tax. If the alternative minimum tax is higher than the regular tax, the taxpayer pays the difference.

The state's alternative minimum taxpayers were previously allowed to deduct charitable contributions made only to Minnesota-based charities. But a case brought before the state tax court ultimately led the state Supreme Court to rule that federal interstate commerce laws prohibit charitable donations, regardless of where the charity is located, from being deducted in calculating the state alternative minimum tax.

According to nonpartisan House Research staff, if no changes were made to the law, the state would have stood to collect an estimated \$20 million more in revenue in 2003.

The Revenue Department estimates that around 10,000 of the state's 24,000 alternative minimum taxpayers have federal adjusted gross incomes of less than \$100,000 per year. Nearly 800 make more than \$500,000 annually.

Sen. Don Betzold (DFL-Fridley) sponsored the measure in the Senate.

Clarifying the gravel tax

A new law clarifies when the delivery of aggregate materials and concrete block in the state is subject to the state's sales tax.

The special session law specifies that the delivery of aggregate materials and concrete block by a third party is not subject to sales tax if the initial sale was not subject to sales tax. Likewise, delivery is taxable if the sale is taxable.

Rep. Ron Abrams (R-Minnetonka), the House sponsor, said the new law clarifies the legislative intent of a provision in the 2002 omnibus tax law.

Abrams said the original provision had little to no cost associated with it, but since adjournment of the regular session, the department has interpreted the definition more broadly than intended.

Aggregate materials include such items as sand, gravel, and crushed rock mixtures. They are the basic ingredients for a variety of construction products.

The new law is effective retroactive to June 30, 2002.

Sen. Ann Rest (DFL-New Hope), the Senate sponsor, said the Revenue Department indicated to her there were no collections related to the provision and therefore no refunds were owed.
