Bill Summary

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Overview

This bill reduces general fund appropriations to the departments of transportation and public safety and the metropolitan council by \$10.5 million in fiscal 2003 and \$11 million per year in subsequent years. It also rescinds all but \$4 million of the \$44 million appropriation in 2000 to the metropolitan council for a dedicated busway.

The largest reduction, \$7 million, is to the metropolitan council for metro transit operations, to be made up by increases in operating revenue or reductions in service. The bill also reduces state operating assistance for regular-route transit in Duluth. It repeals a law allowing local governments to be reimbursed by the state for costs of extending health insurance benefits of peace officers and firefighters killed or disabled in the line of duty.

Busway appropriation. Reduces the FY 2001 appropriation in the 2000 bonding bill to the metropolitan council for a busway from \$25 million to \$4 million, and rescinds the \$19 million appropriation for this purpose for FY 2002.

exam stations. Reduces the annual base by \$400.000.

- **Large urbanized area service.** Defines "large urbanized area service" for purposes of the department of transportation's greater Minnesota transit assistance program as service, other than elderly and handicapped service, provided by the Duluth transit authority.
- **Transit assistance funding formulas.** Provides that the share of total operation costs for large urbanized area service that must come from local sources is 45 percent. Under present law this service is in the same 40 percent category as other urbanized area service.
- **Repealer.** Repeals the law that provides for state reimbursements to local units of government for costs of extending insurance coverage to peace officers and firefighters disabled in the line of duty and

their dependents, and to dependents including spouses of peace officers and firefighters killed in the line of duty.

9 **Effective date.** Makes all sections effective April 1, 2002, except that sections 6 to 8 are effective July 1, 2002.
