Overview

Expands the responsibilities of chemical assessment teams. Expands the definition of hazardous materials. Makes technical amendments to liability and workers' compensation provisions.

Section

- 1 Chemical assessment team. Expands the responsibilities of chemical assessment teams ("CAT") to include mitigating damage from a hazmat incident. Requires a CAT team to make recommendations to the local incident manager on how to control an incident.
- 2 Hazardous materials. Expands the definition of hazardous materials to include (1) hazardous materials intentionally, as opposed to accidentally, released and (2) chemical and biological substances and toxic gasses.
- 3 **Liability.** Makes a technical change to the section of law addressing liability for regional hazardous materials teams to ensure that it covers both chemical assessment teams and emergency response teams.
- Workers' compensation. Makes a technical change to the section of law addressing workers' compensation for regional hazmat teams to ensure that it covers both chemical assessment teams and emergency response teams.
