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Subject: Omnibus Ag Policy Bill

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Overview

House File 1213 is the omnibus agriculture policy bill. It brings Minnesota rules concerning foods and packaging into conformity with new federal regulations. Organic food law has been handled at the state level. Passage of federal organic food laws has made it possible for all states to adopt a single, uniform, national organic food law. House File 1213 brings Minnesota into compliance with federal law and repeals Minnesota's conflicting laws on organic foods.

- Packaged blended rice. Existing law that exempts some blends of wild rice from labeling requirements are modified to restrict the exemption.

- Food and drug rules; conformity with federal regulation. Provides that applicable federal regulations on food and drug are adopted as Minnesota Rules.
- 8 Fishery products rules; conformity with federal regulation. Updates Minnesota Rules on

fishery products to conform with federal regulations.

- 9 Meat and poultry rules; conformity with federal regulation. Updates Minnesota meat and poultry rules to conform with federal meat and poultry regulations.
- Standards for fresh fruits, vegetables, and other products; conformity with federal regulation. Incorporates federal regulations on standards for fresh fruits, vegetables, and other products as Minnesota Rule.
- Dairy grade rules; manufacturing plant standards; conformity with federal regulation. Adopts as Minnesota Rule the federal regulations on grading and inspection standards for manufacturing dairy plants and products.
- Identity, quantity, and fill of container rules; conformity with federal definitions and standards. Adopts as Minnesota definitions and standards the federal definitions and standards for identity, quality, and fill of container.
- Consumer commodities labeling rules; conformity with federal regulation. Requires that all labels of consumer commodities must conform with federal regulations adopted under the Fair Packaging and Labeling Act.
- **Definition; federal law.** Defines federal law as the newly adopted U.S. code sections.
- **Definition; organic.** Amends the definition of organic to comply with federal law.
- **Definition; organic production.** Creates a new definition for "organic production."
- **Uniformity with federal law.** Adopts federal law and regulation as Minnesota's organic food production law and rule.
- **Commissioner duties.** Removes certain of the commissioner's obligations prescribed in current law and adds an emphasis on the marketing of the products of organic agriculture.

Expands the content of a biennial report to the legislature on organic agriculture.

Establishes a 14-member "organic advisory task force" to advise the commissioner on ways to improve organic agriculture in the state. The task force expires June 30, 2005.

Allows the commissioner to receive and spend funds to assist the industry.

Gives the commissioner the option of requiring registration of organic producers and handlers in the state, including those who would be exempted under federal law.

- **Definition; Dairy Product; conformity with federal regulation.** Adopts as the Minnesota definition the federal definition for dairy products.
- Milk quality standards; penalties. For purposes of enforcement of milk quality standards, changes the term "dairy plant field service representative" to "qualified dairy sanitarian."
- **Rules; Grade A milk.** Updates a reference to U.S. Department of Health ordinances that set standards and requirements for Grade A milk, milk products, and goat milk.
- **Raw milk storage.** Reduces from 76 hours to 72 hours the maximum time milk can be held on the farm before being picked up for processing.
- Milk for manufacturing; quality standards. Updates a reference to USDA requirements for manufacturing milk production and processing standards.
- Extension of expiration date; emergency restrictions on the movement of people, livestock, machinery, and personal property. Extends by two years (to July 31, 2005) the expiration of emergency powers to respond to disastrous animal disease outbreaks.
- 25 Minimum ethanol content required. Amends a current requirement that most gasoline sold in Minnesota must contain 2.7 percent oxygen to requiring a minimum of 9.8 percent of

denatured ethanol.

- **Repealer; anaplasmosis testing requirements.** The section of statute requiring that imported breeding cattle be accompanied by a recent test for anaplasmosis is repealed. Also, the rules adopted to enforce the requirement are repealed.
- **Repealer; Minnesota grown; organic certification; definition of milk.** Repeals sections of law that included definitions and requirements related to Minnesota Grown and organic food certification. Also repeals the obsolete Minnesota statutory definition for milk, skim milk, and lowfat milk (in all cases federal definitions are adopted).
- **Effective date.** Sections 24 and 26 are effective the day following final enactment.
