1	Exposing domestic animals to disease. A person who intentionally exposes domestic
	animals (farm-raised deer, game birds, fish; or other animals listed by Agriculture
	Department rule) to an animal disease is guilty of a gross misdemeanor and is liable for civil
	damages equal to three times the value of the exposed animals.
2	Trespass on agricultural land. A person who intentionally and without permission enters a
	livestock area that has been properly posted as a bio-security area is guilty of a gross
	misdemeanor. Minimum requirements for properly posting are stipulated. Penalty does not
	apply to state or county regulatory agents conducting an inspection on posted property.
3	Effective date. The criminal and civil provisions of sections 1 and 2 are effective August 1,
	2004.
