Under current law, a home rule charter or statutory city, town, or county with a civilian review authority for complaints against peace officers, must pay the attorney fees and other costs the peace officer incurs in defending a complaint if the complaint is not upheld at a hearing before the civilian review authority.

This bill strikes reference to the hearing so the fees must be paid if the complaint is sustained by the civilian review authority and then later not upheld.

Effective August 1, 2004.
