Bill Summary

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Overview

This bill expands certain rights of victims of juvenile crime. The bill also amends the Revenue Recapture Act as it pertains to the rights of a non-liable spouse who is entitled to a refund from a claimant agency.

Section

- Residence. Amends the court services data practices section by adding a subdivision that allows a victim of a juvenile crime or delinquent act to request and receive the juvenile offender's current city of residence. Currently, this data is only available to victims who need it to collect restitution.
- **Delinquency hearings.** Permits parents or guardians of minor-age victims of juvenile crimes to attend and participate in the perpetrator's juvenile delinquency hearings.
- **Public inspection of records.** Permits prosecutors to share juvenile offender information with victims without the victim making a formal written request for the information.
- Time limit to request an allocation of refund. Amends the Revenue Recapture Act so that an offender's spouse has 90 days (currently 18 months) to claim his or her share of a joint tax refund owed by the Department of Revenue.
- **Definition of victim.** Expands the definition of victim in the victim rights chapter (611A) to include parents or guardians of minor-age victims of crime. The change is intended to ensure that parents are allowed to attend juvenile court hearings when their children are victims of the delinquent act.
