- 1 **Renting out state property.** Allows the Ft. Snelling chapel rental fee to be deposited from the current general fund to the natural resources fund state parks account.
- 2 **See section 0.**
- 3 **Tettegouche state park.** Provides for the MNDOT Tettegouche Park rest area for free access by the public.
- 4 **Red River State Recreation Area.** Provides for free access by the public in the Red River State Recreation Area outside of the campground.
- 5 **Receipts, appropriation.** Requires that fees collected for tours at Mystery Cave in Forestville State Park be deposited in the state parks working capital account.
- 6 **Minneapolis lease.** States that approval of the Executive Council is not required for the lease or issuance of a liquor license at the Ft. Snelling polo grounds. Allows a repayment not exceeding \$450,000 by officer's row tenants for water line costs by the Minneapolis Park and Recreation Board.
- 7 **Disposition of proceeds.** Provides for revenue generated from the lease of Ft. Snelling upper bluff to be deposited in the natural resources fund state park account.
- 8 **State park additions.** Contains additions to Cascade River, Charles A. Lindberg, Crow Wing, Forestville Mystery Cave, George H. Crosby Manitou, Itasca, Maplewood, Monson Lake, Split Rock and Tettegouche state parks.
- 9 **Recreation area addition.** Adds areas to Cuyuna county state recreation area.
- 10 **Repealer.** Repeals statutory language relating to Ft. Snelling leases that is no longer needed because of this bill's provisions.
