Overview

This bill requires the Commissioner of Education to establish a working group to develop a plan to improve the quality of Minnesota's student information systems. The bill appropriates an unspecified amount of money for the purpose of contracting with a vendor to provide an enhanced, web-based student information system.

Section

- 1 Statewide information and reporting system working group; study and report.
 - **Subd. 1. Working Group Convened.** Directs the Commissioner of Education to convene a working group composed of representatives of school districts, charter schools, area learning centers, staff from the departments of education and administration, and up to three others with experience in web-based student information systems. Directs the working group to develop a plan to improve the quality of Minnesota's student information systems.
 - **Subd. 2. Request for proposals.** Charges the working group with the task of developing the framework for a Request for Proposals (RFP).
 - **Subd. 3. RFP award.** Requires the Commissioner of Education to issue an RFP for a master contract.

Section

Subd. 4. School district participation. Allows school districts to voluntarily participate in the project.

Subd. 5. Regional management information centers. Allows the vendor that receives the contract under this section to subcontract with the state's regional management information centers to provide training and other services.

Appropriations. Appropriates an unspecified amount of money to implement a master contract and to fund conversion and training costs.
