Overview

This bill makes various changes to driver's license laws, including: removing disqualification for commercial driver's license for an alcohol concentration at or above 0.04 but below 0.08; amending the definition of conviction; adding required contents to a driver's license; and, establishing a minimum cancellation period for insufficient, incorrect, or fraudulent information on a driver's license application.

Section

- 1 Test refusal; driving privilege lost.** Removes commercial driver's license disqualification for a person tested as having an alcohol concentration at or above 0.04 but less than 0.08.
- 2 Conviction.** Adds to the definition of "conviction" (1) a plea of no contest and (2) payment of a fine or court cost. This definition applies to the chapter on driver's licenses and training schools.
- 3 License; contents.** Adds license class, endorsements, and restrictions as items that a driver's license must show.
- 4 Cancellation.** Establishes a minimum period of driver's license cancellation when a licensee provides insufficient, incorrect, or fraudulent information on an application. The proposed period is the longer of 60 days or until the correct information is provided. Also makes technical changes.
