Overview

Declares that probationary teachers as of September 10, 2001, whose probationary period is interrupted for active military service have satisfied the requirement for consecutive teaching service that is a precondition of having a continuing teaching contract.

Section

1 Probationary period. Declares that probationary teachers in school districts other than first class city school districts who interrupt their period of probation for active military service and then subsequently promptly resume teaching, consistent with federal reemployment guidelines for uniformed service personnel, are considered to have met the requirement that they have a consecutive teaching experience before becoming eligible for a continuing contract.

2 Makes this section retroactively effective from September 10, 2001.
Probationary period; discharge or demotion. Declares that probationary teachers in first class city school districts who interrupt their period of probation for active military service and then subsequently promptly resume teaching, consistent with federal reemployment guidelines for uniformed service personnel, are considered to have met the requirement that they have a consecutive teaching experience before becoming eligible for a continuing contract.
