## Overview

This bill modifies the cap on punitive damages that currently exists for claims brought under the Minnesota Human Rights Act. The bill also specifies that a prosecution under the new mortgage fraud criminal statute does not preclude prosecution for other criminal conduct.

## **Section**

- **1 Human Rights Act; Punitive Damages.** Increases the cap on punitive damages for claims of discrimination under the Minnesota Human Rights Act. In all claims of discrimination brought against a party, including political subdivisions, the cap would be raised to \$25,000.
- 2 Mortgage Fraud. Provides that a sentence imposed for violation of the new mortgage fraud statute does not limit the ability of the state to prosecute a person for conduct which constitutes a crime based on any other section of law.
