Overview

This bill requires that sudden infant death and shaken baby syndrome training address reducing the risk not just for infants, but for children to age 5.

Section

- **1 Sudden infant death and shaken baby syndrome for child foster care providers.** Amends §245A.144. Adds that this required training is to address reducing the risk of sudden infant death and shaken baby syndrome in infants and young children up to five years of age.
- 2 Training on risk of sudden infant death syndrome and shaken baby syndrome by other programs. Amends §245A.1444. Adds that this required training is to address reducing the risk of sudden infant death and shaken baby syndrome in infants and young children up to five years of age. This section applies to licensed chemical dependency programs that serve clients with young children who sleep at the program, and licensed children's residential facilities.
- **3 Sudden infant death syndrome and shaken baby syndrome training.** Amends §245A.40, subd. 5. Adds that this required training for child care center employees is to address reducing the risk of sudden infant death and shaken baby syndrome in infants and young children up to five years of age.
- 4 **Sudden infant death syndrome and shaken baby syndrome training.** Amends §245A.50, subd. 5. Adds that this required training for family child care center providers is to address reducing the risk of sudden infant death and shaken baby syndrome in infants and young children up to five years of age.
