Overview

This bill provides a veteran wishing to take the statewide peace officer licensing exam with some alternative means for qualifying to do so.

Under current law, a person who: (1) has been discharged from the military, and (2) has relevant military experience, is eligible to take the Minnesota peace officer licensing reciprocity exam. "Relevant military experience" is defined as being "five years of active duty military police service."

The bill would broaden eligibility for the exam by providing the following three alternatives definitions of "relevant military experience:"

- 1) five years active service experience in a military law enforcement occupational specialty (which is equivalent to current law); or
- three years of such active service experience, and completion of a two-ormore year degree from a regionally accredited postsecondary education institution; or
- 3) five years cumulative experience as a full-time peace officer in another state and/or such active service experience.

Unchanged by the bill is the requirement that the person have been honorably discharged from the military before being eligible to take the exam.
