Overview

This bill modifies the boundaries of House of Representatives districts 39A and 39B (Stillwater City and Stillwater Township), and 49A and 49B (Edina) that were contained in the order of the Minnesota Special Redistricting Panel issued February 21, 2012. The boundaries of Senate Districts 39 and 49 are also codified into statute, but remain unchanged from the Special Redistricting Panel's order.

The boundary changes are provided in map form on the website of the Geographic Information Systems Office of the Legislative Coordinating Commission.

1 Thirty-Ninth District (Stillwater City and Stillwater Township). In subdivision 2, codifies the boundaries of House of Representatives districts 39A and 39B into statute. The boundaries referenced in the bill modify the boundaries ordered by the Special Redistricting Panel on February 21, 2012.

Based on 2010 U.S. Census data, the population deviation from the ideal will remain within the acceptable standard ordered by the Special Redistricting Panel.

2 Forty-Ninth District (Edina). In subdivision 2, codifies the boundaries of House of Representatives districts 49A and 49B into statute. The boundaries referenced in the bill modify the boundaries ordered by the Special Redistricting Panel on February 21, 2012.

Based on 2010 U.S. Census data, the population deviation from the ideal will remain within the acceptable standard ordered by the Special Redistricting Panel.

- **3 Repealer.** Repeals sections of statute enacted in 2003 and 2004 that modified certain House of Representatives district boundaries following the Special Redistricting Panel's order in 2002. After the newly-ordered boundaries take effect, these district descriptions will become obsolete.
- 4 **Effective date.** Provides that the changes contained in this bill are effective beginning at the 2012 state primary and state general elections for the terms of office that will begin in January 2013.
