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## Bill Summary =

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**Subject:** Small business construction contracting bid preferences

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#### Overview

Article 1 of this bill amends a preference program in bidding for Minnesota Department of Transportation (MnDOT) construction work that is state funded but not federally funded. Changes include clarifying subcontracting goals and requirements, setting a matching bid preference for veteran-owned small businesses compared to a preference for targeted group businesses, requiring a periodic disparity review for targeted group businesses, limiting bid preference eligibility, requiring a legislative report, and moving provisions into new subdivisions.

Article 2 authorizes counties to create a bid-preference program for veteran-owned small businesses competing for county contracts to provide the county with goods, services, and construction-related work.

### **Article 1: Department of Transportation Contracting**

- **Small business contracts.** Makes various changes to the MnDOT bid preference program for veteran-owned small businesses and targeted group businesses.
  - **Subd. 1. Definitions.** No changes made.
  - **Subd. 2. Small targeted group business, small business; contract preferences.** Clarifies that the contracting preference available to small businesses in economically disadvantaged areas is for specified construction work. Removes provisions governing subcontracting and veteran-owned small business preferences, which are recreated in new subdivisions elsewhere in the bill.
  - **Subd. 2a. Small targeted group business; subcontracting goals.** Re-establishes and amends language, moved from another part of this section of statutes, on goals for subcontracting to targeted group businesses.
  - **Subd. 2b. Veteran-owned small business; contract preferences.** Re-establishes and amends language, moved from another part of this section of statutes, on authorizing MnDOT to provide a bid preference to veteran-owned small businesses in bids for state-funded (and not

- federally funded) construction work, including professional and technical services. Requires that if a bid preference is established for veteran-owned small businesses, it must be at least the same percentage as any preference provided for targeted group businesses.
- **Subd. 2c. Veteran-owned small business; subcontracting goals.** Re-establishes and amends language, moved from another part of this section of statutes, on goals for subcontracting to veteran-owned small businesses.
- **Subd. 3. Small targeted group business subcontract awards.** No changes made.
- Subd. 3a. Veteran-owned small business; subcontract awards. Makes technical changes.
- Subd. 4. Contract awards, limitations. Makes technical changes.
- **Subd. 4a. Small targeted group business; limited duration and reevaluation.** Establishes requirements for period evaluation of disparities in the proportional share of contract awards to targeted group businesses.
- Subd. 5. Recourse to other businesses. Makes technical changes.
- **Subd. 6. Rules; eligibility.** Limits eligibility for the bid preferences under this section. Establishes an eight-year window for the preference following: the effective date of the changes in the bill; initial certification, for a targeted group business; or initial certification or discharge of a business owner from military service, for a veteran-owned small business.
- **Subd. 7. Noncompetitive bids.** No changes made.
- **Subd. 8. Reporting.** Establishes an biennial legislative report on the bid preference program. Specifies report content.
- **Subd. 9. Veteran-owned small business; purpose.** Identifies legislative purpose with respect to the veteran-owned small business bid preference.

#### **Article 2: Authorizing Counties**

County bid preference program authorized. Authorizes counties, at the discretion of each county, to create a bid preference program for veteran-owned small businesses competing for county contracts for goods and services, including construction-related services. This program is modeled on existing law for state agencies.
