Subject Enhanced criminal penalties for assaulting firefighters or medical personnel

Overview

This bill amends section 609.2231 which criminalizes assaults on firefighters and emergency medical personnel. The bill makes the following changes to the statute:

- 1. Expands the class of protected persons to include all medical providers who work in a hospital. The current law applies only to medical providers who work in a hospital emergency room.
- 2. Creates a gross misdemeanor penalty for a physical assault on a firefighter or a medical provider who works in a hospital where the assault does <u>not</u> cause demonstrable bodily harm. The current law applies only when there is demonstrable bodily harm.
- 3. Creates a felony offense punishable by up to three years in prison and a fine of \$6,000 for intentionally throwing or transferring bodily fluids or feces onto a firefighter or a medical provider who works in a hospital.
- 4. Increases the maximum period of imprisonment for assaulting a firefighter or a medical provider who works in a hospital when the assault causes demonstrable bodily harm from two years to three, and increases the maximum fine from \$4,000 to \$6,000.
