Overview

This bill establishes a Rotary International special license plate. Among the requirements to obtain the plate, a vehicle owner must donate \$25 on initial application and \$5 annually for Rotary International.

[§ 168.1283] Rotary International plates.

Creates a new Rotary International special license plate. Plate application and issuance begins January 1, 2020.

Subd. 1. Issuance of plates. Sets requirements to obtain the special plate, including ownership of an eligible passenger-type vehicle or motorcycle, payment of a \$10 fee as well as other applicable fees and taxes, and a donation of \$25 for the first application and \$5 annually after that.

Subd. 2. Design. Directs the Department of Public Safety to design the plate with a Rotary International symbol and the inscription "Service Above Self."

Subd. 3. Plates transfer. Sets a \$5 fee and requirements in order to transfer the plate to another qualifying vehicle.

Subd. 4. Exemption. Exempts the plates from application requirements governing new special license plate proposals, including a survey, marketing strategy, and application fee.

Subd. 5. Fees. Identifies deposit of fee revenue.

Subd. 6. Contributions; account; appropriation. Creates a Rotary Foundation account that holds the annual donation and makes a statutory appropriation of the donated funds. The appropriation is first for Department of Public Safety administrative costs, with the remaining funds distributed to Rotary Foundation to further the organization's mission.
