Overview

Minnesota generally requires free admission to public school for students who are not yet 21 years of age and have not yet graduated from high school. The calculation of services depends on the student's birthday and whether the student is receiving special education services.

H.F. 995 authorizes a student who is in 9th grade no later than the 2023-2024 school year and has not yet graduated to remain eligible for continued free public school enrollment until the first September after the pupil's 22nd birthday.
