Overview

The K-12 finance budget contains an appropriation for grants to certain children's museums. The appropriations for fiscal years 2022 and 2023 totaled \$610,000 each year. These annual appropriations included:

- \$269,000 for the Minnesota Children's Museum in St. Paul;
- \$50,000 each year for the Children's Museum of Rochester (Spark);
- \$50,000 each year for the Duluth Children's Museum;
- \$41,000 each year for the Minnesota Academy of Science;
- \$50,000 each year for the Headwaters Science Museum;
- \$50,000 each year for the Children's Museum of Southern Minnesota;
- \$50,000 each year for the Works Museum in Bloomington; and
- \$50,000 each year for Children's Discovery Museum of Grand Rapids.

Some museum programs also receive funding from Legacy funds. The base budget for grants to support children's museums is \$460,000 each year as funding for Children's Museum of Southern Minnesota, the Works Museum in Bloomington, and the Children's Discovery Museum of Grand Rapids were onetime only for fiscal years 2022 and 2023.

H.F. 1023 appropriates \$50,000 each year in fiscal years 2024 and 2025 for a grant to the Rochester Children's Museum which also goes by the name "Spark."
