Overview

Minnesota authorizes several different types of cooperative units to provide services to students. One type of cooperative is a career and technical cooperative. The Wright Technical Center, established in 1972, is a cooperative providing career and technical instruction, transitional services (for students ages 18 through 21 with an Individualized Education Program) and area learning center (ALC) services to students enrolled in eight school districts located in Wright and Sherburne Counties. Wright Technical Center provides these services across 14 subject areas.

Funding for cooperatives, including Wright Technical Center, primarily comes from fees paid by the cooperative's member school districts.

H.F. 2069 provides a \$9.5 million capital grant from the state to Wright Technical Center for its facility needs.
