Overview

The Office of Cannabis Management has authority to approve for retail sale, product categories of cannabis flower, cannabis products, lower-potency hemp edibles, and hemp-derived consumer products. This bill prohibits the Office of Cannabis Management from approving cannabis flower, cannabis products, or hemp-derived consumer products that are consumed by inhaling smoke, aerosol, or vapor from the product and that have a taste or smell other than cannabis.

1 Approval of cannabis flower, products, and cannabinoids.

Amends § 342.06. Prohibits the Office of Cannabis Management from approving any cannabis flower, cannabis product, or hemp-derived consumer product that is intended to be inhaled as smoke, aerosol, or vapor from the product and that:

- Contains artificial, synthetic, or natural flavoring;
- Describes or depicts flavor that implies the product contains flavors other than the taste or smell of cannabis;
- Imparts a taste or smell, other than the taste or smell of cannabis, distinguishable by a consumer before or during consumption of the product; or
- Imparts a cooling, burning, numbing, or other sensation distinguishable by a consumer to impart a flavor other than cannabis before or during consumption of the product.
