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The following House Files were introduced:

Hollins, Agbaje and Reyer introduced:

H. F. No. 3159, A bill for an act relating to human services; modifying purpose of law for permanency dispositions when a child cannot be placed with parents; modifying permanency dispositions when a child cannot return home; amending Minnesota Statutes 2020, sections 260C.001, subdivision 3; 260C.513.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Human Services Finance and Policy.

Hausman introduced:

H. F. No. 3160, A bill for an act relating to transportation; capital investment; appropriating money for passenger rail infrastructure; authorizing the sale and issuance of state bonds.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Capital Investment.

Wolgamott introduced:

H. F. No. 3161, A bill for an act relating to health; directing the commissioner of health to modify a requirement to obtain a Department of Health recommendation for the J-1 visa waiver program.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Health Finance and Policy.

Freiberg introduced:

H. F. No. 3162, A bill for an act relating to health; providing for the operation of Tribal medical cannabis programs; establishing dual registration of Tribal patients; providing for transportation of medical cannabis by manufacturers registered with Tribal medical cannabis programs; authorizing Tribal compacts regarding medical cannabis; requiring a report; amending Minnesota Statutes 2020, sections 152.22, subdivisions 3, 7, 9, 10, 13, by adding subdivisions; 152.27, by adding a subdivision; 152.29, subdivisions 2, 4; 152.30; 152.32, subdivision 2; Minnesota Statutes 2021 Supplement, sections 152.22, subdivision 11; 152.29, subdivisions 1, 3; 152.31; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 152.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Health Finance and Policy.

Moller introduced:

H. F. No. 3163, A bill for an act relating to human services; modifying background study requirements for out-of-home respite provided to minors in unlicensed settings; modifying the definition of unit of service for the purposes of individualized home supports with training; permitting additional time-limited extensions of cosigned leases in community-living settings; authorizing market rates for disability waiver respite services; amending Minnesota Statutes 2020, sections 245C.04, subdivision 1; 256B.49, subdivision 23; 256B.4914, subdivisions 2, 3, 7, 8, 9, 10; Minnesota Statutes 2021 Supplement, sections 245C.05, subdivision 5; 256B.4914, subdivisions 5, 6; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 245D.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Human Services Finance and Policy.

Sandstede introduced:

H. F. No. 3164, A bill for an act relating to mining; improving coordination, effectiveness, transparency, and accountability of environmental review and permitting process for metallic mineral mining projects; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 93.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources Finance and Policy.

H. F. No. 3165, A bill for an act relating to workers' compensation; providing for workers' compensation presumption reimbursement; appropriating money.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Taxes.

No. 3168, A bill for an act relating to motor vehicles; amending requirements governing establishment and discontinuance of special license plates; amending a fee; appropriating money; requiring a report; amending Minnesota Statutes 2020, section 168.1293; repealing Minnesota Statutes 2020, sections 168.1256, subdivision 4; 168.1282, subdivision 4; 168.1294, subdivision 4; 168.1295, subdivision 7; Minnesota Statutes 2021 Supplement, sections 168.1284, subdivision 4; 168.1285, subdivision 4; 168.1286, subdivision 5.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Transportation Finance and Policy.

H. F. No. 3169, A bill for an act relating to capital investment; appropriating money for the greater Minnesota child care facility program.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Capital Investment.

Nelson, M., introduced:

H. F. No. 3170, A bill for an act relating to capital investment; appropriating money for an anaerobic digestion facility in Brooklyn Park; authorizing the sale and issuance of state bonds.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Capital Investment.

Murphy introduced:

H. F. No. 3171, A bill for an act relating to capital investment; appropriating money for improvements to secondary clarifiers in the Western Lake Superior Sanitary District; authorizing the sale and issuance of state bonds.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Capital Investment.

Hollins, Keeler, Agbaje and Reyer introduced:

H. F. No. 3172, A bill for an act relating to state government; establishing a Council on LGBTQIA Minnesotans; limiting criminal defenses and authorization for the use of force relating to a victim's sexual orientation or identity; prohibiting conversion therapy with children or vulnerable adults; prohibiting medical assistance coverage for conversion therapy; prohibiting the misrepresentation of conversion therapy services or products; requiring a report; amending Minnesota Statutes 2020, sections 256B.0625, by adding a subdivision; 325F.69, by adding a subdivision; 609.06, by adding a subdivision; 609.075; 609.20; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapters 15; 214.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on State Government Finance and Elections.

H. F. No. 3173, A bill for an act relating to economic development; appropriating money for grants to nonprofits experiencing financial hardship as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic; requiring reports.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Transportation Finance and Policy.

H. F. No. 3179, A bill for an act relating to early childhood; allowing a child care center and a family child care provider to adopt a policy regarding immunizations; amending Minnesota Statutes 2020, section 121A.15, subdivision 3, by adding a subdivision.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Early Childhood Finance and Policy.

No. 3188, A bill for an act relating to public safety; appropriating money to provide reimbursements to state and local law enforcement agencies that have paid incentive bonuses to encourage individuals to become peace officers; requiring a report; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 299A.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Public Safety and Criminal Justice Reform Finance and Policy.

H. F. No. 3189, A bill for an act relating to capital investment; appropriating money for Phase 6 of the infrastructure improvements project in the city of Biwabik; authorizing the sale and issuance of state bonds.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Capital Investment.

H. F. No. 3197, A bill for an act relating to capital investment; appropriating money for capital improvements to the Chisholm Sports Arena and Curling Club; authorizing the sale and issuance of state bonds.
