1.2 (H0896DE3), as follows:

1.3 Page 34, after line 11, insert:

1.4 "Sec. 5. [243.521] ADMINISTRATIVE AND DISCIPLINARY SEGREGATION.

1.5 Subdivision 1. Authorization. In any adult correctional facility under the control of the
1.6 commissioner of corrections, the commissioner may require an inmate to be placed in
1.7 disciplinary segregation for rule violations involving use of a weapon or infliction of bodily
1.8 harm, escape, or a major rule violation, or in administrative segregation for the safety of
1.9 the inmate or others, subject to the requirements of this section.

1.10 Subd. 2. Conditions in segregated housing. The segregation unit shall provide regular
1.11 meals, furnished cells, appropriate reading materials, limited recreational facilities, at least
1.12 five hours a week out of cell unless safety and security dictate otherwise, reduced lighting
1.13 during the nighttime hours, rights of communication and visitation by those properly
1.14 authorized, and other privileges as may be established by the commissioner.

1.15 Subd. 3. Review of disciplinary segregation status. An inmate who serves 15 days in
1.16 disciplinary segregation shall have the inmate's segregation status reviewed at that time by
1.17 the warden of the institution and every 15 days thereafter. An inmate who serves 60 days
1.18 in disciplinary segregation shall have the inmate's segregation status reviewed at that time
1.19 by the commissioner of corrections, or a deputy or assistant commissioner, and every 30
1.20 days thereafter.

1.21 Subd. 4. Graduated disciplinary sanctions. The commissioner shall design and
1.22 implement a graduated scale of responses to infractions, including reprimands, loss of
1.23 privileges, and restriction of motion within the institution, so that the use of disciplinary
1.24 segregation is reserved for the most serious and persistent infractions.

2.1 Subd. 5. Discharge from segregated housing. (a) The commissioner shall not release
2.2 an inmate to the community directly from segregated housing. A segregated inmate must
2.3 serve at least 30 days in the general population prior to the inmate's release to the community,
2.4 absent a documented, compelling safety reason, approved by the warden.

2.5 (b) An inmate who is being released from segregated housing to the general population
2.6 after serving in that status for 30 days or more shall have the transfer reviewed and approved
2.7 by a mental health professional prior to returning to the general population.

2.8 Subd. 6. Reporting. By January 15, 2018, and by January 15 each year thereafter, the
2.9 commissioner of corrections shall report to the chairs and ranking minority members of the
2.10 house of representatives and senate committees with jurisdiction over public safety and
2.11 judiciary on the status of the implementation of the provisions in this section. This report
2.12 shall include, but not be limited to, data regarding:

2.13 (1) the number of inmates in each institution placed in segregation during the past year;

2.14 (2) the ages of inmates placed in segregation during the past year;

2.15 (3) the number of inmates transferred from segregation to the mental health treatment
2.16 unit;

2.17 (4) the nature of the infractions leading to the use of segregation;

2.18 (5) the lengths of terms served in segregation, including terms served consecutively;

2.19 and

2.20 (6) any incidents of inmates not receiving at least five hours a week out of cell."
