Emerging Farmer Working Group

Background:

- The Emerging Farmer Working Group (EFWG) is a stakeholder group created by the 2020 legislative session which provides feedback to all divisions of the MDA on how to serve emerging farmers
- Past three cohorts of about 33 members served two-year terms representing 20 counties
- Current Cohort 4 members represent 12 counties
 - Farmers and aspiring farmers who are women, veterans, persons with disabilities, American Indian or Alaskan Native, members of a community of color, young (35 and under), LGBTGIA+, and urban

Emerging Farmers Office-Implementation

- FY24 Hired Director, Sr. Grants Specialist, and Outreach and Engagement Coordinator
- \$275,000 technical assistance grants to Community Development Financial Institutions (CDFI) ongoing work
- Beginning Farmer Equipment and Infrastructure Grants ongoing work
- \$25,000 Translation services
- \$577,000 RFA administered Technical Assistance Grants completed in FY2024 (20 eligible applications requesting \$1.5million; 8 awardees)
