1.2 (1SS-H0132DE1), as follows:

1.3 Page 18, line 2, after the period, insert "The commissioner must review the information
1.4 submitted under subdivision 2 for compliance with relevant statutes and regulations."

1.5 Page 18, delete lines 3 to 8 and insert:

1.6 "Subd. 2. Insurers; responsibilities. (a) An insurer that writes property, casualty, or
1.7 liability insurance in Minnesota must submit the following information to the commissioner
1.8 of commerce:

1.9 (1) the number of claims related to businesses affected by riot or civil commotion during
1.10 the peacetime emergency declared by Executive Order 20-64 that it has rejected or has not
1.11 fulfilled;

1.12 (2) the number of policies that were not renewed for businesses:

1.13 (i) affected by riot or civil commotion during the peacetime emergency declared by
1.14 Executive Order 20-64; or

1.15 (ii) unaffected but located in the geographic area where the riot or civil commotion
1.16 occurred;

1.17 (3) any increase in rates for businesses:

1.18 (i) affected by riot or civil commotion during the peacetime emergency declared by
1.19 Executive Order 20-64; or

1.20 (ii) unaffected but located in the geographic area where the riot or civil commotion
1.21 occurred; and

1.22 (4) any other information requested by the commissioner which is relevant to the
1.23 evaluation of an insurer's compliance with relevant statutes and regulations.

- 2.1 (b) The information required to be submitted under this subdivision must be:
- 2.2 (1) in form and substance acceptable to the commissioner;
- 2.3 (2) provided upon request of the commissioner; and
- 2.4 (3) provided to the commissioner by January 1, 2021, and June 1, 2021.
- 2.5 (c) Only insurers who have received claims, not renewed policies, or increased rates, as
- 2.6 described in paragraph (a), must submit information to the commissioner. "
