I am writing to oppose the Education Policy Omnibus Bill (HF1081). There is no need to change homeschool standardized testing requirements, resulting in more unwanted and unnecessary paperwork for both Minnesota homeschoolers and districts. I am also concerned that government agents and those without constitutional authority would be able to view private data. This reporting requirement would be in direct conflict with the 2011 Homeschool Mandate Reduction Bill for simpler reporting requirements without unnecessary paperwork.
