Subject: Accessibility Standards for Legacy grantees

Dear Mr. Heller,

You recently asked questions at a MN House Legacy Hearing Committee meeting and I wanted to follow up with you on the information you requested.

I've reached out to TPT, MPR, and AMPERS to request information from them on their accessibility standards and web accessibility and that I plan to forward that on to the committee chair, members of the committee, and to you as soon as I have it.

I also wanted to let you know that state agencies are required to meet certain accessibility standards based on statute.

Minnesota Statutes section 16E.03, subd. 9 requires state agencies to comply with certain national technology accessibility standards. Those standards are outlined here:

It is a busy time of year so I do not know when those groups will get back to me but when I receive a response I will forward it on to you.
