
MNHS CBR Review

- **1. Historic Sites Asset Preservation**
- MNHS is responsible for 150+ structures statewide
- Nearly half of these structures are over 100 years old
- Sites are part of statutorily defined Historic Sites Network in Mn Statutes 138

 a state responsibility
- Asset Preservation Projects for Historic Structures take specialized design and construction techniques as they all must follow the Secretary of Interior's Standards for the Treatment of Historic Properties
- Modern visitor centers are approaching life-cycle of repair or replacement







 - Plan and construct additional off-site collections storage facility




