1.3 "Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 171.13, subdivision 1, is amended to read:

1.4       **Subdivision 1. Examination subjects and locations; provisions for color blindness, disabled veterans.** (a) Except as otherwise provided in this section, the commissioner shall  
1.5       must examine each applicant for a driver's license by such agency as the commissioner  
1.6       directs. This examination must include:

1.8       (1) a test of the applicant's eyesight;

1.9       (2) a test of the applicant's ability to read and understand highway signs regulating,  
1.10      warning, and directing traffic;

1.11      (3) a test of the applicant's knowledge of (i) traffic laws; (ii) the effects of alcohol and  
1.12      drugs on a driver's ability to operate a motor vehicle safely and legally, and of the legal  
1.13      penalties and financial consequences resulting from violations of laws prohibiting the  
1.14      operation of a motor vehicle while under the influence of alcohol or drugs; (iii) railroad  
1.15      grade crossing safety; (iv) slow-moving vehicle safety; (v) laws relating to pupil  
1.16      transportation safety, including the significance of school bus lights, signals, stop arm, and  
1.17      passing a school bus; (vi) traffic laws related to bicycles; and (vii) the circumstances and  
1.18      dangers of carbon monoxide poisoning;

1.19      (4) an actual demonstration of ability to exercise ordinary and reasonable control in the  
1.20      operation of a motor vehicle; and

1.21      (5) other physical and mental examinations as the commissioner finds necessary to  
1.22      determine the applicant's fitness to operate a motor vehicle safely upon the highways.

2.1       (b) Notwithstanding paragraph (a), no driver's license may be denied to an applicant on  
2.2       the exclusive grounds that the applicant's eyesight is deficient in color perception. War  
2.3       veterans operating motor vehicles especially equipped for disabled persons, if otherwise  
2.4       entitled to a license, must be granted such license.

2.5       (c) The commissioner ~~shall~~ must make provision for giving the examinations under this  
2.6       subdivision either in the county where the applicant resides or at a place adjacent thereto  
2.7       reasonably convenient to the applicant.

2.8       (d) The commissioner ~~shall~~ must ensure adequate staffing at all testing locations so that  
2.9       an applicant is able to obtain an appointment for an examination to demonstrate ability  
2.10      under paragraph (a), clause (4), within 14 days of the applicant's request or to retake the  
2.11      examination within 30 days of failing if, under the applicable statutes and rules of the  
2.12      commissioner, the applicant is eligible to take or retake the examination."
