FACILITIES FALLOUT

RURAL SCHOOLS FACE FACILITIES FALLOUT BECAUSE DEFERRED MAINTENANCE COMPETES FOR GENERAL FUND DOLLARS THAT SHOULD BE SUPPORTTING STUDENT AND STAFF NEEDS.
