Bill Description

HF3617 designates specific uses for Critical Habitat license plate contributions based on the license plate type selected by the vehicle owner. Contributions from plates featuring big game, turkey, pheasant, or other types not specified, must be used to purchase land or on land programs. Contributions from plates featuring loon, chickadee, or lady slipper must be used for nongame wildlife management purposes. Contributions from plates featuring anglers or fish must be used for aquatic management area purposes. Contributions from plates featuring bees or other pollinators must be transferred to the Board of Water and Soil Resources (BWSR). This bill would require a bi-annual legislative report on expenditures from the critical habitat private sector matching account.

Assumptions

We assume that this bill does not increase the amount of revenues available in the Reinvest in Minnesota-Gifts account, nor does it increase or decrease expenditures overall. But because the DNR will now transfer to BWSR, we anticipate expenditures from DNR specifically will go down by the same amount. Continuing DNR expenditures will be allocated across the new categories.

MN Department of Public Safety provided numbers of vehicles registered with critical habitat license plates for FY23. Our projections assume that the percentage of choices across categories will remain the same, which we apply to the FY23 amount transferred into the DNR Reinvest in Minnesota-Gifts account.

We assume that transfers to BWSR would be made after matching funds have been secured by BWSR as required by MS 84.943 subd 3.

Further, we assume that funds made available for nongame wildlife management (loon, chickadee, and lady slipper plates) can be used for the purposes of the new 84.943 Subd 5b as renumbered in this bill.

2023 session law made up to \$2.225 Million available for transfer from the critical habitat private sector matching account for wildlife management areas acquisition, restoration, and enhancement in FY25 (ML2023 060 01 003 06m). Assuming

this bill is effective in FY25, we would allocate FY25 revenue by license plate and make this transfer from any remaining FY24 revenues.

Legislative Report

The biennial legislative report would require staff from multiple divisions, and efforts would include coordination across project areas, data gathering and analysis, narrative drafting, and creative services. The estimated number of hours would be about 100 total, or .05 FTE. Using the DNR's average annual employee cost of \$134,000, the estimated cost of the legislative report would be \$7,000 every two years.

Long-Term Fiscal Considerations

Transfers to BWSR will continue past FY27.

Work on legislative reports will continue every other year.

Bill Description

A bill for an act relating to natural resources; modifying use of critical habitat private sector matching account; requiring reports; appropriating money; amending Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 84.943, subdivision 5. For BWSR, the bill specifies that proceeds from sales of license plates with pollinator images will transfer from the DNR to BWSR to fund grants under Lawns to Legumes program. DNR is required to submit a biennial report on the expenditure of money starting in January 2026.

Assumptions

Currently there is one state of Minnesota plate that depicts a bee. Based on the Minnesota Department of Public Safety Driver and Vehicle Services Special License Plates information, that plate has sold 18,370 plates over three years. According to the DNR, this represents 7.22% of registered critical habitat license plates. Based on the DNR's receipt of \$6.7 million from the Department of Public Safety for critical habitat plates in FY23, this resulted in an estimated \$484,000 for the pollinator plates. BWSR assumes that we will receive this same amount in an annual transfer from DNR in future years.

Expenditure and/or Revenue Formula

It is assumed that there would be no staffing costs to accept the transfer of these funds, and that current agency expenditures in administering Lawns to Legumes would be unimpacted. For the biennial reporting requirement, BWSR assumes it will take approximately 18 hours (or less than 0.01 FTE) of staff time. Using an estimated annual BWSR employee cost of \$124,000 per FTE, the estimated cost for BWSR to assist DNR in providing the information needed for the report would be \$1,000 every two years.

Long-Term Fiscal Considerations

BWSR will receive an estimated \$484,000 annually from the DNR, based on the number of vehicles registered with pollinator plates.
