The Minnesota Council on Disability would like to express our strong support for House File 4143, a bill that seeks to ensure that landlords are required to disclose that assistance animals are not subject to pet fees. This is a significant step forward in recognizing and upholding the rights of tenants with disabilities who rely on service or support animals for their daily living and wellbeing.

The requirement for landlords to make clear in lease agreements that additional fees, charges, or deposits for service or support animals are prohibited underlines the importance of transparency and fairness in housing policies. Furthermore, this bill empowers tenants with the ability to recover any unjust fees paid to landlords under pet policies, provided they meet certain conditions.
