

#### Catch Up

#### Minnesota Property Tax Refund

- Available to homeowners and renters
- Based on income and rent or property taxes
- Landlords create Certificate of Rent Paid, issue to tenant by 1/31




#### Catch Up

#### Starting in Tax Year 2024...

- Renter's claim as an income tax credit on Form M1, Individual Income Tax
- Homeowner's claim on the M1PR, Property Tax Refund

### Project Timeline: 2017 through 2023



#### Project Timeline: 2024 and 2025

#### 2024

- Analyze e-Services CRP registration and submission data.
- Gather feedback from customers.
- Second round of usability testing of CRP system with landlords around the state.
- e-Services CRP system improvements.
- Move Renter's portion to Form M1, Individual Income Tax Return.
- Second round of communication and outreach to landlords.

#### 2025

- Landlords required to use e-Services to submit CRPs
- Customers claim Renter's portion on Form M1.
- Homeowners continue claiming Property Tax Refund on M1PR.



- Develop resources and training
- Utilize stakeholder network
- Conduct community engagement
- Issue direct mailings
