1.8	Subdivision 1. <b>Districts and schools permitted to maintain supply.</b> (a) Notwithstanding
1.9	section 151.37, districts and schools may obtain and possess epinephrine auto-injectors to
1.10	be maintained and administered by school personnel to a student or other individual if, in
1.11	good faith, it is determined that person is experiencing anaphylaxis regardless of whether
1.12	the student or other individual has a prescription for an epinephrine auto-injector. The
1.13	administration of an epinephrine auto-injector in accordance with this section is not the
1.14	practice of medicine.
1.15	(b) Registered nurses may administer epinephrine auto-injectors in a school setting
1.16	according to a condition-specific protocol as authorized under section 148.235, subdivision
1.17	8. Notwithstanding any limitation in sections 148.171 to 148.285, licensed practical nurses
1.18	may administer epinephrine auto-injectors in a school setting according to a condition-specific
