

1.1 moves to amend H.F. No. 1883 as follows:

1.2 Page 1, line 6, delete "must" and insert "may"

1.3 Page 1, after line 11, insert:

1.4 "(c) The commissioner of health and commissioner of education must jointly report on
1.5 best practices for maintaining a supply of opiate antagonists at a school site, including
1.6 training and qualifications requirements for persons administering opiate antagonists. The
1.7 report must recommend statutory or other changes necessary to implement the best practices.

1.8 (d) A school district is encouraged to develop and regularly update a drug prevention
1.9 and intervention program that addresses opiate antagonists, including policies and procedures
1.10 relating to medical emergencies and overdose response strategies."

1.11 Page 1, after line 12, insert:

1.12 "Sec. 2. **APPROPRIATION; OPIATE ANTAGONIST SUPPLY GRANTS.**

1.13 Subdivision 1. **Department of Education.** The sums indicated in this section are
1.14 appropriated from the general fund to the Department of Education in the fiscal year
1.15 designated.

1.16 Subd. 2. **Opiate antagonist supply.** (a) For grants to purchase and distribute opiate
1.17 antagonists in schools:

1.18 \$ 2023

1.19 (b) A school district, charter school, tribal contract school, cooperative unit under section
1.20 123A.24, subdivision 2, political subdivision, or nonprofit organization with experience
1.21 distributing opiate antagonists in Minnesota is eligible for a grant under this subdivision.

1.22 (c) Grant funds may be used to purchase and distribute opiate antagonists, and to train
1.23 school staff to administer opiate antagonists.
