- **The Mutit-Craft Core Curriculum (MC3)**

Construction Apprenticeship Preparation schools provide students with hands-on learning opportunities in the construction building trades career fields while using the Multi-Craft Core Curriculum (MC3). The MC3 is a nationally recognized, comprehensive apprenticeship-readiness training curriculum, and offers a pathway towards a construction career.

Minnesota leads the nation with our Construction Apprenticeship Preparation (CAP) Schools. A CAP school specializes in construction career-focused learning (such as welding, solar, plumbing and carpentry) and provide training opportunities, hands-on skills practice, guest speakers, field trips and overall industry awareness. Each school offers different courses and opportunities.

In addition, the Construction Careers Foundation provided MC3 (Multi-Craft Core Curriculum) training to high school personnel. We also started convening the groups of schools for them to learn from one another. This convening was placed on hold in 2020 - and - it is our intent to start the convening up again.

The following schools received training:

Future Statewide Vision and Activities

In addition to our current activities, over the next couple of years, CCF aims to move to a stronger statewide model by implementing and strengthening the following:

- **More Navigators** – bring on additional individuals to provide guidance/support for youth seeking to enter a construction career pathway post high school graduation.
- **Online learning platform** – provides online Continuing Education training for teachers and apprenticeship awareness for Minnesota educators, counselors, and administrative staff (by end of 2021)
- **Learn2Build** – provide curriculum models for middle school youth (by end of 2021)
- **Summer MN Trades Academy Boot Camp (Mankato Area)** – document lessons learned while consulting with a South-Central group comprised of labor, education, community, and industry representatives who sought to replicate/create a youth summer construction program. The program is two-weeks long and provides stipends to participating youth. The intent is to design something similar that can be replicated in other parts of the state (2022).
- **Construct Tomorrow** – The 2021-2022 draft event schedule calls for events in Shakopee (2-days); the State Fair Grounds; Rochester; Mankato, St. Cloud; Hinckley; Duluth (2 days); and Moorhead from September 2021 to March 2022 academic year.
