| 1 | <p><b>Confession; inadmissible when deception is used.</b></p> <p>Prohibits the use of an admission in court when a person is in custody and the interrogating official used false information about evidence or communicated an unauthorized statement regarding the potential leniency of a sentence that could be issued. However, the presumption that the confession is inadmissible can be overcome if the state proves by a preponderance of the evidence that the statement was voluntary and not induced by any the false information related to evidence or leniency.</p> |
