1.3 Page 163, after line 14, insert:

1.4 "Sec. 10. [256E.245] TASK FORCE ON CHILDHOOD TRAUMA-INFORMED
1.5 POLICY AND PRACTICES.

1.6 Subdivision 1. Establishment. The commissioner of human services must establish and
1.7 appoint a task force on trauma-informed policy and practices to prevent and reduce children's
1.8 exposure to adverse childhood experiences (ACEs) consisting of the following members:

1.9 (1) the commissioners of human services, public safety, health, and education or the
1.10 commissioners' designees;

1.11 (2) two members representing law enforcement with expertise in juvenile justice;

1.12 (3) two members representing county social services agencies;

1.13 (4) two members from the house of representatives, one from the majority party,
1.14 appointed by the speaker, and one from the minority party, appointed by the minority leader;

1.15 (5) two members from the senate, one from the majority party, appointed by the majority
1.16 leader, and one from the minority party, appointed by the minority leader;

1.17 (6) two members representing tribal social services providers;

1.18 (7) two members with expertise in prekindergarten through grade 12 education;

1.19 (8) two members with expertise in childhood trauma-informed policies and practices
1.20 and ACEs;

1.21 (9) three licensed health care professionals with expertise in the neurobiology of
1.22 childhood development representing public health, mental health, and primary health;

1.23 (10) one member representing family service or children's mental health collaboratives;

2.1 (11) two parents who had ACEs;

2.2 (12) two ombudspersons from the Minnesota Office of Ombudsperson for Families; and

2.3 (13) representatives of any other group the commissioner of human services deems

2.4 appropriate to complete the duties of the task force.

2.5 Subd. 2. **Staff.** The commissioner of human services must provide meeting space, support

2.6 staff, and administrative services for the task force.

2.7 Subd. 3. **Duties.** The task force must perform the following duties:

2.8 (1) engage the human services, education, public health, juvenile justice, and criminal

2.9 justice systems in the creation of trauma-informed policy and practices in each of these

2.10 systems to prevent and reduce ACEs and to support the health and well-being of all families;

2.11 and

2.12 (2) identify social determinants of the health and well-being of all families and

2.13 recommend solutions to eliminate racial and ethnic disparities in the state.

2.14 Subd. 4. **Report.** The task force must submit a report on the results of its duties outlined

2.15 in subdivision 3 and any policy recommendations to the chairs and ranking minority members

2.16 of the legislative committees with jurisdiction over health and human services, public safety,

2.17 judiciary, and education by January 15, 2019, and by January 15 of each year thereafter.

2.18 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective the day following final enactment."
