1.16 second year are for minerals cooperative
1.17 environmental research, of which \$34,000
1.18 the first year and \$34,000 the second year are
1.19 available only as matched by \$1 of nonstate
1.20 money for each \$1 of state money. The
1.21 match may be cash or in-kind.

1.22 \$251,000 the first year and \$251,000 the
1.23 second year are for iron ore cooperative
1.24 research. Of this amount, \$200,000 each year
1.25 is from the minerals management account
1.26 in the natural resources fund. \$175,000 the
1.27 first year and \$175,000 the second year are

2.1 available only as matched by \$1 of nonstate
2.2 money for each \$1 of state money. The match
2.3 may be cash or in-kind. Any unencumbered
2.4 balance from the first year does not cancel
2.5 and is available in the second year.

2.6 \$2,755,000 the first year and \$2,815,000
2.7 the second year are from the minerals
2.8 management account in the natural resources
2.9 fund for use as provided in Minnesota
2.10 Statutes, section 93.2236, paragraph (c),
2.11 for mineral resource management, projects
2.12 to enhance future mineral income, and
2.13 projects to promote new mineral resource
2.14 opportunities.

2.15 \$200,000 the first year and \$200,000 the
2.16 second year are from the state forest suspense
2.17 account in the permanent school fund to
2.18 accelerate land exchanges, land sales, and
2.19 commercial leasing of school trust lands and
2.20 to identify, evaluate, and lease construction
2.21 aggregate located on school trust lands. This
2.22 appropriation is to be used for securing
2.23 long-term economic return from the
2.24 school trust lands consistent with fiduciary
2.25 responsibilities and sound natural resources
2.26 conservation and management principles.

2.27 Notwithstanding Minnesota Statutes, section
2.28 115B.20, \$1,000,000 the first year is from
2.29 the dedicated account within the remediation
2.30 fund for the purposes of Minnesota Statutes,
2.31 section 115B.20, subdivision 2, clause (4),
2.32 to acquire salt lands as described under
2.33 Minnesota Statutes, section 92.05, within
2.34 Bear Head Lake State Park. This is a onetime
