This plan to give out pills so they can kill themelves preemptively, the more it is used, the more it will become casual and easy to choose for those who fear, feel worthless, are in a darkness. These pills are a failure of true caring, failure to accompany those in despair, failure to love and sacrifice for others, failure of humanity! I know many Hospice nurses do handle the worst severe cases of pain, they can already give all the meds they need in due time, in due time... if we let the Hospice nurses treat true pain (not fear of pain) in the minute and hour it is needed.
