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

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

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
MEDICAID 101



- 1. Medicaid provides *health coverage* to *people with low incomes.*
- 2. Medicaid is *jointly funded and regulated* by both the federal and state / territorial governments.
- 3. States and territories can *exercise flexibility* through the state plan, *waivers*, and state-funded programs.



SECTION 1115 WAIVERS 101



- 1. Federal approval and funding to waive federal requirements.
- 2. Broad or narrow.
- 3. Reflects White House administration priorities.
- 4. Budget neutral to federal government.
- 5. Monitoring and evaluation.

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BACKGROUND Section 1115 Waivers for Health-Related Social Needs



HEALTH-RELATED SOCIAL NEEDS

- Individual's unmet, adverse social conditions that contribute to poor health
- May account for <u>40%</u> to <u>50%</u> of health outcomes

OPPORTUNITIES

- Eligibility flexible
- Infrastructure
- Housing
 - Up to 6 months rent
- Nutrition
 - Medically tailored meals, pantry stocking, food prescriptions (6 months)

LIMITATIONS


- Non-Medicaid state and local partnerships
- Spending cap (services + infrastructure)
- Social service spending
- Provider rates
- Clinical and social risk criteria

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REENTRY WAIVERS

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BACKGROUND Section 1115 Reentry Waivers

MEDICAID INMATE EXCLUSION POLICY

- Prohibits federal funding for *services* provided to "inmates of public institutions"
- Exception for inpatient hospital care
- 2018 SUPPORT Act

OPPORTUNITIES


- Funding for:
 - Pre-release services
 - IT systems and capacity building
- Flexibility in population, services, facilities, providers, and scope

LIMITATIONS

- Minimum services:
 - Case management
 - Medication-assisted treatment
 - 30-day supply of medications
- Time (90-days prerelease)

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CHILDREN AND YOUTH IN FOSTER CARE

- New coverage requirement (state plan benefit)
- Up to 30 days pre-release
- Effective January 1, 2026




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
