1.13 (a) **Problem Gambling.** \$225,000 in fiscal
1.14 year 2022 and \$225,000 in fiscal year 2023
1.15 are from the lottery prize fund for a grant to
1.16 the state affiliate recognized by the National
1.17 Council on Problem Gambling. The affiliate
1.18 must provide services to increase public
1.19 awareness of problem gambling, education,
1.20 training for individuals and organizations
1.21 providing effective treatment services to
1.22 problem gamblers and their families, and
1.23 research related to problem gambling.

1.24 (b) **Recovery Community Organization**
1.25 **Grants.** \$2,000,000 in fiscal year 2022 and
1.26 \$2,000,000 in fiscal year 2023 are from the
1.27 general fund for grants to recovery community
1.28 organizations, as defined in Minnesota
1.29 Statutes, section 254B.01, subdivision 8, to
1.30 provide for costs and community-based peer
1.31 recovery support services that are not
1.32 otherwise eligible for reimbursement under
1.33 Minnesota Statutes, section 254B.05, as part
1.34 of the continuum of care for substance use

2.1 disorders. The general fund base for this
2.2 appropriation is \$2,000,000 in fiscal year 2024
2.3 and \$0 in fiscal year 2025

2.4 **(c) Grant to Anoka County for Enhanced**
2.5 **Treatment Program.** \$125,000 in fiscal year
2.6 2023 is from the general fund for a grant to
2.7 Anoka County for an enhanced treatment
2.8 program for substance use disorder. This
2.9 paragraph does not expire.

2.10 **(d) Base Level Adjustment.** The general fund
2.11 base is \$4,636,000 in fiscal year 2024 and
2.12 \$2,636,000 in fiscal year 2025. The opiate
2.13 epidemic response fund base is \$500,000 in
2.14 fiscal year 2024 and \$0 in fiscal year 2025."
