HF 40 (Howard) State rent assistance program established for lowincome cost-burdened households, and money appropriated.

To solve the affordable rental housing crisis and disparities in rental and homeownership we need to increase people's incomes and/or provide housing that is affordable to people with limited resources. (See attached 5 decades of growing homelessness). "Just because you are poor does not mean you need supportive housing, we need housing that is affordable." Junail Freeman Anderson. We have the housing resources to fund HF40, to help people with limited income have housing that is affordable if we create more equity between how we fund homeowners and rental housing in the State. (See info below and attached)

Background: On the Federal level and State Level: Homeowners receives 4-5X more subsidy than renters for their housing. This funding primarily comes through the tax expenditure budget

The following are some of the housing subsidies Minnesota Homeowner Owners will receive in Minnesota tax deductions in FY 21 for mortgage interest (\$83.4 Million), property tax (\$52.5 Million), capital gains (\$186.6 million), and homestead credit (\$154.5 Million). In Minnesota, we will spend \$1 Billion/ year of mortgage revenue bonds for first time homebuyer mortgages. In addition, we will fund down payment assistance and rehab loans in the MHFA Budget.
