

In 2019, the historical MHC Event Center hosted 381 meetings and events, serving 11,054 clients.

In 2020, despite interruptions due to COVID-19, the Event Center hosted 266 meetings and events, serving 8,632 clients.



During the FY2019 & 2020, despite the challenges presented by significant impact due to COVID-19, MHC was still able to conduct outreach to all Minnesotans.

Those efforts resulted in 180 grants to 152 individuals and organizations in 23 counties across Minnesota.
