

I am writing to voice my opposition to the **Omnibus Bill** in the House Education Policy Committee that will be discussed on Wednesday, March 10, 2021 at 1:00 PM.

I oppose the proposed language in this bill.

“A letter of intent to continue to provide instruction must include a report to the superintendent with proof that the testing plan for the previous year was fulfilled as agreed upon, a copy of the official test scores, and information required in paragraph (a) for each student for the upcoming school year.”

This re-wording would be a significant step backward for homeschooling freedom in Minnesota. It would impose unnecessary and burdensome requirements on Minnesota homeschoolers and districts. And, it could provide government officials or other agents with the unconstitutional authority to see private data. Parents should be the ones who decide how their children are educated.
