My background

- Bridge builder in economic, workforce, and community development at **Initiative Foundation** in Little Falls
- Former senior leader at the Small Business Administration

Early areas of focus

- In-person meetings with partners across the state, including businesses like DigiKey and Polar Semiconductor to ST Paper, Microbiologics, Cirrus, BOOMCHICKAPOP, chambers of commerce, development corps, workforce development boards, trade associations, and nonprofit grantees – plus Governor's trade missions.
- Effective implementation of programs funded in 2023 session, as detailed in later slides.







Minnesota is a Great Place to Live and Work

- **Our population grew 0.4%** in 2023, ranking 25th nationally.
- Minnesota ranks well in overall mood (4th Happiest State in 2023 by WalletHub), poverty levels (9.6%, 5th lowest nationally), and education (4th for high school diploma at 94%, and 13th for 4-year degree, at 39.1%).
- Minnesota ranked **13th in median household income** at \$82,338 in 2022.
- But, despite strong growth last year, our labor force has not recovered to pre-pandemic levels. We are still -0.7% below February 2020 levels.
- The more we can do to address our workforce challenges, the faster our economy will be able to grow.





Economic Snapshot: Significant Strength in Our Economy

Strong Job Growth and Low Unemployment:

- We've added jobs for six straight months.
- Minnesota has 3,008,000 jobs more than ever before.
- Our unemployment rate is 2.9%, better than the US average (3.7%), though that lower rate also means workforce challenges.

Our Labor Force:


- Our labor force participation rate is 68.1%, compared to 62.5% nationally. **7th highest nationally.**
- But we know that **labor force is still the biggest issue our state faces** – we're hearing it from employers everywhere.



ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

The State of Business in Minnesota

- CNBC: Minnesota ranks as the **5th best state for business**
- Minnesota is home to 15 Fortune 500 companies and 8 of Forbes' Largest Private Companies.
- Minnesota small businesses are taking off: business applications are soaring, more businesses are opening than closing, and we rank first in 5-year business survival rates, at 57.6%
- Businesses continue expanding here: in 2023 we tracked 116 expansions, worth \$7.6 BILLION in outside investment, to create 3,900 jobs.
- DEED's job is to keep that going! Here's how.



Implementing an Historic Slate of Programs

- DEED received almost **\$1.8 billion** in total funding for FY24-25 following **historic investments** in our legislative priorities in 2023.
- Effective and efficient implementation of the programs supported by these investments has been my highest priority since joining DEED.
- And that's where our tagline comes in that's how "DEED Delivers" for Minnesota's Businesses, Workers and Communities.







Cultivating a dynamic business environment

Financing Programs

Administer over 45 financing programs that provide capital to growing businesses and communities:

- MN Job Creation Fund 12 awards for \$6.5 million, resulting in 737 jobs and \$535 million investment
- MN Investment Fund 9 loans for \$8 million, resulting in 600 jobs and \$312 million investment
- Emerging Entrepreneur Program 32 loans for \$950,000
- **MN Angel Tax Credit** 90 approvals for \$4.3 million
- Launch MN Grants 43 awards for \$1.2 million
- State Small Business Credit Initiative 25 loans for \$5.6 million
- Job Training Programs 21 grants for \$1.9 million

- **Brownfields and Redevelopment** 12 grants for \$4.1 million
- Small Cities Development Program 38 grants for \$25 million



Minnesota Forward Fund

A one-time flagship investment of \$400 million for

the Minnesota Forward Fund – to attract business, leverage federal funds, and deploy capital quickly.

- \$50,000,000 Matching funds required by federal programs
- \$100,000,000 DOD matching funds for a bio industrial manufacturing pilot or an aerospace center or both
- \$250,000,000 CHIPS matching funds

EMPLOYMENT AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

- DEED is working with the entities on implementing their projects and building the ecosystem to support these industries.
- DEED funding requires federal awards to be made



Energy Transition Grant Program

The Jobs bill provided **\$10 million** in new funding in the FY24-25 biennium for the **Energy Transition Grant Program** to support impacted areas by providing resources for these communities to diversify their economies and find new opportunities for quality jobs and economic growth.

- DEED awarded **\$1.4 million** to Granite Falls and Fergus Falls in January, with another grant round soon.
- The Energy Transition Office also held an Energy Transition Summit for the impacted areas and has convened the Energy Transition Advisory Council.





Supporting small businesses

PROMISE Act

- PROMISE Act Grants \$94.95M for working capital through the Neighborhood Development Center (NDC).
- PROMISE Act Loans \$30.3M for development through the Metropolitan Economic Development Association (MEDA).
- Partners have been holding information sessions in the geographies identified.
- Program portal will open this spring.





Expanding Opportunity Fund

- The Expanding Opportunity Fund provides **capital for small businesses** through partnerships with nonprofit lenders.
- DEED will make investments in lenders through long term loans to the organization and allowing them to revolve the capital.
- These funds will fill **gaps** not funded with the PROMISE Act or direct appropriations.
- Funding awards expected in March.






Small Business Assistance Partnerships

- This program allows nonprofit small business partners to meet the high level of demand for business development and technical assistance services.
- Awarded **\$12M to 41 organizations** to assist businesses and entrepreneurs focused on equity, innovation and vibrancy.
- In addition, DEED will administer \$34 million in direct appropriations to 17 organizations that deliver technical assistance and loans.

Breakdown of Clients Served by Partner Organizations - 2023

Small Business Development Center/Launch Minnesota

- The Small Business Development Center (SBDC) offers no-cost technical assistance across Minnesota to entrepreneurs and small businesses.
- SBDC helped 288 unique small businesses access \$131 million in capital and provided 30,158 hours of consulting to 4,418 businesses.



- Launch Minnesota empowers and elevates the innovation ecosystem to make Minnesota the best place to start and scale new ventures.
- Leveraged \$19.80 for every \$1 granted through innovation grants.
- Hosted events, connecting **31 startups to 283 investors** inside and outside of Minnesota.
- **700 businesses** received lean start up education through partners.



Child Care

Child Care Economic Development Grants

- Record funding to grow child care availability: \$15 million in the FY24-25 biennium and \$3 million in the FY26-27 biennium.
- We just opened our largest-ever grant round for this program <u>– RFPs are due by 4pm on March 12th.</u>

Office of Child Care Community Partnerships

- Recently hired a new Director and will be hiring staff.
- Working across agencies and communities.

Adult-Use Cannabis Programs

• **Request for Information** out in Q2 - gathering information from experts, both inside and outside of MN, to inform the creation of these programs so they support a craft and social equity focused industry.

DEED will seek nonprofit lenders, technical assistance providers and workforce development training partners to implement the following programs:

CanStartup - \$6 million FY24-25: supports financing for cannabis microbusinesses.

CanNavigate - \$2 million FY24-25: supports technical assistance programs for businesses in the legal cannabis industry.

CanTrain - \$4 million FY24-25: training for careers in the legal cannabis industry.
